- Special Film Screenings: *Extreme Private Eros: Love Song 1974*. Friday, May 11, 2007, 7:00 p.m. Located at Askwith Auditorium, Lorch Hall, 611 Tappan Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan. Directed by Kazuo Hara. In the profoundly personal film about political and sexual revolution, Hara paints a portrait of his abusive former lover, Miyuki Takeda. She is a determined feminist involved in bisexual and interracial relationships. Hara's intense "home movie" follows her to the military bases of Okinawa, climaxing with her most unusual and "independent" childbirth. Kazuo Hara will introduce this film and take part in a post-screening Q&A.
- Feature Event: A Public Conversation with Kazuo Hara and Michael Moore, Saturday, May 12, 2007, 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. (doors open at 6:30 p.m.) Located at Michigan Theater, 603 East Liberty, Ann Arbor, Michigan. While making *Roger and Me* in 1988, Michael Moore saw Kazuo Hara's *The Emperor's Naked Army Marches On* at the AFI Theater in the Kennedy Center. The file, Moore said, "had a profound influence" on him. Hara, who calls his work "Action Documentary", considers Moore a kindred spirit.
- *The Emperor's Naked Army Marches On*. Saturday, May 12, 2007, 9:30 p.m. Located at the Michigan Theater, 603 East Liberty, Ann Arbor, MI. Moore calls this film "the most amazing piece of filmmaking." It centers around Kenzo Okuzaki, a WWII vet of the fighting on New Guinea. Forty years after the fact, Okuzaki visits his former comrades with Hara to investigate the ambiguous

circumstances behind the summary execution of two privates. When memories of the vets prove “faulty,” Okuzaki pries the information out in the most shocking of ways – on camera.
